Justices Set to Determine Whether Off-Duty Officer is Entitled to Immunity; Gongwer, September 26, 2022

The Ohio Judicial Conference is dedicated to serving all Ohio judges. The Judicial Conference is the voice of the judiciary & a primary resource to ensure the fair, unbiased, open & effective administration of justice.

- <u>HB 724</u> (Rep. Blackshear) **Digital Drivers' Licenses**, introduced 9.27.22. The bill authorizes the use of a digital driver's license or state ID card.
- <u>HB 725</u> (Rep. Lanese, Hoops) **Canine Medical, Dental Procedures**, introduced 9.27.22. The bill prohibits individuals, other than licensed veterinarians, from performing medical and dental procedures on dogs.
- <u>SB 362</u> (Sen. Hoagland) **Permanent Motor Vehicle Registration-Retired Veterans**, introduced 10.03.22. The bill authorizes permanent motor vehicle registration for retired veterans.
- The Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction (ODRC) is responsible for administering the Targeted Community Alternatives to Prison (T-CAP) grant program. The T-CAP grant program provides funding to counties who participate in the program and submit Memorandums of Understanding (MOUs) indicating their willingness to participate (see ORC §2929.34 and §5149.38). In preparation for the FY 24/25 operating budget, ODRC is requesting input regarding which counties intend to participate in the T-CAP grant program. This input is important as it will assist the ODRC in determining the amount of funding to request from the general assembly to support the T-CAP grants. ODRC is requesting that counties provide an email response from one person authorized to respond on behalf of the county to DRC.BCSgrants@odrc.state.oh.us by Friday 10.21.22 with county name and FY24/25 T-CAP participation level.
- The Ohio State Bar Association has assumed the responsibility of managing the website for <u>Judicial Votes Count</u>. For judges who have yet to complete the <u>judicial candidate questionnaire</u>, please consider doing so.
- •The OJC's Jury Instructions Committee has completed **14 new jury instructions**, some necessitated by recent statutory changes. The new instructions are available on the OJC website and include: use of non-deadly force in self-defense, the defense of another, or the defense of a residence; carrying concealed weapons; retaliation; making false claims; criminal mischief; criminal trespass and aggravated trespass; and trafficking in persons.
- Just **5 voting sessions remain** in the 134th General Assembly per chamber: 11.16.22 (House and Senate), 11.30.22 (House and Senate), 12.1.22 (House), 12.7.22 (Senate), 12.14.22 (House and Senate), and 12.21.22 (House and Senate).
