We all have enjoyed a few days to breathe after the resounding defeat of Issue 1. Senate President Larry Obhof announced two days after the election that he would be introducing legislation to revise the drug code with a comprehensive review of sentencing options, treatment services, and access to employment and housing for recovering addicts. He would like to start the discussion yet this year with a goal of completing legislative action no later than next April. Much will reasonably be expected from judges in guiding that legislative process to achieve sensible change.

While tying up loose ends in the lame duck legislative session, our legislative staff, Marta, Josh and Shawn are mapping plans for several significant legislative objectives that our standing committees and your individual Judicial Associations would like to see enacted in the upcoming General Assembly which begins work next month. Please help us by remaining active on our standing committees and with your Judicial Associations. Across the board all of us will be dealing with new officeholders, new legislators, and new staff at every level while welcoming a significant number of new judges. Change is inevitable, and although it is sometimes hard to embrace, we as judges have the ability to make a tremendous impact and positively shape any pending legislation. UNDERSTANDING THE DISTINCTION BETWEEN 'CONSISTENCY' AND 'PROPORTIONALITY'

Reform of the appeals process is a topic that has been discussed within the Ohio Judicial Con-ference's Appellate Law and Procedure Committee and within the Supreme Court's Criminal Sen-tencing Commission. There is a need for streamlining and defining some of the more unwieldy concepts in Chapter 29 of the Ohio Revised Code, but as yet there is no consensus on how Chapter 29 should be changed. Below is an explanation of consistency and proportionality, two Chapter 29 terms.

"Consistency" is a term related to the purposes and principles of felony sentencing contained in R. C. 2929.11. R. C. 2929.11(A) provides that a felony sentence shall be reasonably calculated to achieve two "overriding purposes" of felony sentencing: (1) "to protect the public from future crime by the offender and others," and (2) "to punish the offender using the minimum sanctions that the court determines accomplish those purposes ***." In order to achieve these purposes, the sentence inposed for a felony must be "commensurate with and not demeaning to the seriousness of the offender's conduct and its impact upon the victim, and <u>consistent with sentences imposed for similar crimes committed by similar offenders.</u>" R. C. 2929.11(B).

{¶4} "Consistency is not the same as "proportionality." "Consistency" is derived from R. C. 2929.11(B) and relates to an offender's sentence <u>compared to that of a similarly situated offender</u>. Id. On the other hand, "proportionality" is a concept derived from consecutive sentencing under R. C. 2929.14(C)(4), or the constitutional prohibition against cruel and unusual punishment. As this writer has previously stated, it is important to note that although courts have minced consistency in sentencing, pursuant to R. Consistency in sentencing pursuant to R. C. 2929.11(B) is not synonymous with uniformity. State v. Cargill, 8th Dist. Cuyahoga No. 103902, 2016-Ohio-5932, ¶ 11. "Consistency accepts diver-gence within a range of sentences and takes into consideration the trial court's discretion to weigh statutory factors." Id. at ¶ 12. quoting State v. Hyland, 12th Dist. Butler No. CA2005-05-103, 2006-Ohio-339, ¶ 29. "Although the offenses may be similar, Dawson, 8th Dist. Cuyahoga No. 86417, 2006-Ohio-1083, ¶31. "[T]he consistency requirement is satisfied when a trial court properly con-siders the statutory sentencing factors and principles."

The concept of proportionality, referring to the shocking to the sense of justice in the commu-nity standard, under the cruel and unusual punishment analysis, or disproportionate to the offend-er's conduce standard set forth in R. C. 2929.14(C)(4) under consecutive sentencing review, <u>focuses</u> on the offender's own conduct as it relates to his crimes, and not to the sentences or conduct of <u>other similarly situated offenders</u>. [State v. Chaffin, 30 Ohio St.2d 13, 17, 282 N.E.2d 46 (1972),] at paragraph three of the syllabus ("[a] punishment does not violate the constitutional prohibition against cruel and unusual punishments, if it be not so greatly disproportionate to the offense as to shock the sense of justice of the community"); R. C. 2929.14(C)(4) ("court may require the offender to serve the prison terms consecutively if the court finds that the consecutive service is necessary to protect the public from future crime or to punish the offender and the consecutive sentences are not disproportionate to the seriousness of the offender's conduct").
