

Legislative News: Two Week Review

- The Chief Justice has convened a <u>Task Force to Examine the Ohio Bail System</u>, which first met 1.23.19. Recommendations of the Task Force, expected in April 2019, will focus on ensuring public safety as well a defendant's appearance at future court hearings. The 24-member Task Force will hear presentation about and discuss risk assessment tools, recognizance bonds, pretrial monitoring, and cash and secured bonds.
- <u>SR 10</u> (Sens. Huffman, McColley) **Honoring Auglaize County Courthouse**, introduced 1.29.19. The resolution honors the Auglaize County Courthouse on its 125th Anniversary.
- The Supreme Court was asked, on 1.14.19 in a memorandum of support from the Public Defender, to clarify language from 2017 HB 49 which capped prison sentences for community control violations to 90 and 180 days for underlying F5s and F4s, respectively (RC 2929.15). The memorandum asserts that "prison sentences for all violations not based upon felony-level criminal conduct should be subject to the statute's caps."



- The Ohio Public Defender has <u>updated</u> the **Standards and Guidelines for Appointed Counsel Reimbursement**, the State Maximum Fee Schedule for Appointed Counsel
 Reimbursement, the County Public Defender Office Reimbursement Standards, and the State
 Public Defender Billing, Payment and Reimbursement.
- Rep. Sykes was chosen as the House Minority Leader, 1.23.19. The other leadership positions of the house Minority Caucus are: Rep. Boggs (assistant Minority Leader), Rep. Smith (Minority Whip), and Rep. Hicks-Hudson (assistant Minority Whip).
- The <u>OJC Court Tech Conference</u> is taking place 4.16.19 with vendor networking opportunities and presentations on e-reminders to reduce warrants; cloud-based video conferencing; and making big tech purchases. Court personnel can <u>register</u> online.
