## **Legislative News: Two-Week Review**

- <u>SB 215</u> (Sen. Johnson) **Duties of Concealed Weapons Licensees**, introduced 8.5.21. The bill generally eliminates the requirement for certain adults to obtain a license in order to carry a concealed handgun; Eliminates the requirement that a person must inform a law enforcement officer if they are carrying a concealed handgun; Establishes a pre-trial immunity process for those asserting a claim of self-defense in civil tort or criminal actions.
- <u>SB 216</u> (Sen. Johnson) **Infants Exposed to Drugs**, introduced 8.10.21. The bill authorizes a public children services agency to conduct an alcohol or drug test on an infant or the infant's mother if the agency receives a report of child abuse regarding an alleged substance-exposed infant. If the test comes back positive, the agency must file a complaint unless the court determines the positive result was due to medication-assisted treatment.
- <u>SB 218</u> (Sen. Antani) **Voyeurism**, introduced 8.10.21. The bill Increases penalties for the offense of voyeurism, for both first-time (from M3 to M1) and repeat offenders (F4 or F5).
- <u>SB 2</u>, which altered the process for **restoration to competency**, went into effect 8.3.21. The OJC's <u>Enactment News</u> is available on our website. Additionally, the OJC has coordinated with the Supreme Court to host a <u>Court Café</u> to provide education on SB 2 implementation, scheduled for 8.31.21 at noon via Zoom. The Court Café panel includes a mental health professional, a probate court magistrate, and a municipal court prosecutor.
- The Centers for Disease Control extended the <u>eviction moratorium</u> until 10.3.2021 in counties with high or substantial COVID-19 transmission rates. Ohio Legal Help provides <u>forms</u> needed by tenants or landlords and rental assistance money is still available through <u>Ohio's Community Action</u> Agencies.
- The Ohio Judicial Conference has prepared a criminal offense list that contains information about every criminal offense in the Ohio Revised Code; it is a work in progress.
- Congratulations to the OJC Chair, Judge Joyce Campbell, who was <u>reelected to the board</u> of the **National Alliance on Mental Illness** (NAMI)! She also serves as the president for the NAMI Ohio Board of Directors.
- Register: The Ohio Judicial Conference's **Annual Meeting** is 9.2 and 9.3.21 with 10+ hours of judicial education. The agenda includes presentations from Supreme Court scholar Professor Erwin Chemerinsky, forensic psychiatrist Dr. Phillip Resnick, and cyber-stalking expert Steven Bradley.
