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MAJOR ORDERS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS, ANNOTATED

- April 24, 2020 President signs additional \$484 billion relief package to replenish the small business lending program and support hospitals and COVID-19 testing. NOTE: This measure did not include any relief for state or local governments. That is expected to be considered in a new COVID-19 relief package to be completed in May.
- April 16, 2020 White House announces guidelines for 'Opening Up America Again'. The guidelines include state or regional gating criteria and three phases for reopening. NOTE: The Governor announced the Ohio guidelines, "Responsible Restart Ohio," on April 28, 2020, including a phased reopening of all businesses and "Responsible Protocols," including recommending face masks and daily health assessments.
- April 16, 2020 The state of Ohio has received \$2.26 billion in CARES Act state and local government funding. This represents the first half of the \$4.5 billion in state and local government funding that Ohio will receive. Additionally, local governments with populations over 500,000 are applying to the Treasury Department directly to receive a portion of the remaining amount of money due to Ohio. These include the city of Columbus as well as Cuyahoga, Franklin, Hamilton, Montgomery, and Summit counties. NOTE: On April 14, 2020, Senate President Obhof discussed legislation to distribute funding made available through the CARES Act "within a few weeks".
- April 9, 2020 The Federal Reserve Board of Governors takes <u>actions</u> to provide up to \$2.3 trillion in loans to support the economy, including creating the <u>Municipal Liquidity Facility</u> to help state and local governments by purchasing up to \$500 billion of short term notes directly from U.S. states, U.S. counties with a population of at least half a million residents, and U.S. cities with a population of at least a guarter million residents.
- April 1, 2020 The Governor announced the President approved the Governor's request for a major disaster
 declaration for Ohio to provide relief for state and local response efforts associated with emergency protective
 measures, such as emergency operations, fire and police, emergency medical care, among other things.
- March 27, 2020 The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act was signed by the President.
- March 16, 2020 The White House <u>released</u> Coronavirus Guidelines for America recommending people avoid discretionary travel and social gatherings larger than 10 people.
- March 15, 2020 The CDC <u>recommended</u> canceling or postponing gatherings of 50 or more people during the next eight weeks.

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MAJOR ORDERS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS, ANNOTATED

 April 24, 2020 – President signs additional <u>\$484 billion relief package</u> to replenish the small business lending program and support hospitals and COVID-19 testing amid the coronavirus pandemic.

NOTE: This measure did not include any relief for state or local governments. That is expected to be considered in a fourth coronavirus relief package to be considered in May.

- April 16, 2020 Senator Portman announced that the state of Ohio has received \$2.26 billion in Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act state and local government funding. This represents the first half of the \$4.5 billion in state and local government funding that the state of Ohio will receive. Governor DeWine and his administration will allocate some of this funding to local governments. Additionally, local governments with populations over 500,000 are applying to the Treasury Department directly to receive a portion of the remaining amount of money due to Ohio. These include the city of Columbus as well as Cuyahoga, Franklin, Hamilton, Montgomery, and Summit counties.
- April 16, 2020 White House announces guidelines for <u>'Opening Up America Again'</u>. The guidelines include state or regional gating criteria and three phases for reopening.

NOTE: Governor DeWine announced the Ohio guidelines, "Responsible Restart Ohio," on April 28, 2020.

- April 13, 2020 U.S. Department of the Treasury Launches <u>Web Portal</u> and Begins Disbursement of CARES Act Funding to State, Local, and Tribal Governments
- April 10, 2020 U.S. Senator Rob Portman (R-OH) announced that the state of Ohio received <u>\$990 million</u> in the
 first wave of federal funding for hospitals and health care providers under the CARES Act.

"[The CARES ACT] provides \$4.5 billion to the state of Ohio and \$150 billion overall to support states and local governments that are impacted by the coronavirus to ensure they can continue to provide basic services for their citizens."

NOTE: On April 13, 2020 - The Ohio Controlling Board voted to <u>approve more than \$248 million</u>, including \$173.9 million in extra funding from the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act for the Ohio Coronavirus Relief Fund.

NOTE: On April 14, 2020, Senate President Obhof discussed legislation to distribute funding made available through the federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act "within a few weeks".

 April 9, 2020 – Federal Reserve Board of Governors takes <u>additional actions</u> to provide up to \$2.3 trillion in loans to support the economy The **Municipal Liquidity Facility** will help state and local governments better manage cash flow pressures in order to continue to serve households and businesses in their communities. The facility will purchase up to \$500 billion of short term notes directly from U.S. states (including the District of Columbia), U.S. counties with a population of at least half a million residents, and U.S. cities with a population of at least a quarter million residents. Eligible state-level issuers may use the proceeds to support additional counties and cities. In addition to the actions described above, the Federal Reserve will continue to closely monitor conditions in the primary and secondary markets for municipal securities and will evaluate whether additional measures are needed to support the flow of credit and liquidity to state and local governments.

- April 1, 2020 Governor DeWine announced the President approved the Governor's request for a major disaster declaration for Ohio to provide relief for state and local response efforts associated with emergency protective measures, such as emergency operations center operations, fire and police services, emergency medical care, sheltering, among other things.
- March 27, 2020 President signs <u>Memorandum</u> on Order Under the Defense Production Act Regarding General Motors Company.
- March 27, 2020 President signs <u>Executive Order</u> Delegating Additional Authority Under the DPA with Respect to Health and Medical Resources to Respond to the Spread of COVID-19.
- March 27,2020 President signs <u>Executive Order</u> to Order the Select Reserve and Certain Members of the Individual Ready Reserve of the Armed Forces to Active Duty

- March 15, 2020 The CDC <u>recommended</u> canceling or postponing gatherings of 50 or more people during the next eight weeks.
- March 14, 2020—The U.S. House of Representatives passed the Families First Coronavirus Response Act
- March 13, 2020—President Trump <u>declared</u> a National Emergency concerning the novel coronavirus disease outbreak.
- March 13, 2020—The Department of Defense issued restrictions on domestic travel for DoD components.
- March 11, 2020—The Department of Defense <u>issued</u> restrictions on foreign travel for DoD components.
- March 11, 2020—HHS announced that the CDC will be <u>awarding over \$560 million</u> to state and local jurisdictions to support COVID-19 response.
- March 11, 2020—State Department <u>issued</u> a "Global Level 3 Health Advisory Reconsider Travel" advising U.S. citizens to reconsider travel abroad.
- March 11, 2020—President Donald Trump <u>issued a proclamation</u> limiting entry of foreign nationals who have been in European countries, excluding the U.K. and Ireland, during the 14-day period preceding their entry or attempted entry into the United States.
- March 11, 2020 The White House Task Force on Coronavirus and the Centers for Disease Control and
 Prevention released two documents (<u>Actions for All Americans</u> and <u>A Framework for Mitigation</u>) to assist State,
 local, tribal, and community leaders in slowing the transmission of COVID-19.
- March 6, 2020 President Trump signed the <u>Coronavirus Preparedness and Response Supplemental</u>
 <u>Appropriations Act, 2020</u> (H.R. 6074), a \$8.3 billion <u>supplemental spending package</u>. The bill designates \$1.05 billion for grants to state and local governments and allows funds to be used to reimburse state and local costs already incurred.
- March 5, 2020—CMS <u>announced the development of a new code</u> that can be used by health care providers and laboratories to bill for certain COVID-19 diagnostic tests to help increase testing and track new cases. The announcement was accompanied by new fact sheets that explain Medicare, Medicaid, Children's Health Insurance Program, and Individual and Small Group Market coverage for services.
- March 4, 2020—CMS <u>announces actions</u> to address the coronavirus, including an enhanced focus on infection control procedures and guidance for nursing homes

- March 4, 2020—CDC updated its <u>guidance for evaluation of Persons Under Investigation</u> to include a wider group of individuals in an effort to make testing more widely available.
- March 4, 2020—CDC announces initial funding to jurisdictions to support COVID-19 response efforts.
- March 2, 2020—CDC and FDA announced they are taking <u>emergency action</u> to allow more types of respirators to be used in health care settings amid several outbreaks of coronavirus in multiple states.
- February 29, 2020—FDA <u>issued a new policy</u> for certain laboratories seeking to develop diagnostic tests for coronavirus in order to achieve more rapid testing capacity in the U.S.
- February 29, 2020 President Donald Trump <u>issued a proclamation</u> suspending entry of foreign nationals who have been in Iran within the past 14 days.
- February 28, 2020—CDC <u>updated its guidance</u> on testing and evaluation of suspected cases, expanding the criteria for who should be tested.
- February 24, 2020—The White House <u>sent Congress a request</u> of \$2.5 billion in total resources for coronavirus response efforts, including \$1.25 billion in new emergency supplemental funding.
- February 4, 2020—FDA issued an <u>emergency use authorization</u> to enable use of CDC's diagnostic test, permitting its use by certified state and local public health laboratories across the United States and abroad.
- February 2, 2020—State Department issued <u>a travel advisory for China</u>
- February 2, 2020—Department of Homeland Security <u>directed all flights</u> from China and all passengers who have traveled to China within the last 14 days to be routed through one of eight U.S. airports, with three airports added on February 3.
