## **Legislative News: Two Week Review**

- <u>SB 3</u> (Sens. Eklund, O'Brien) **Drug Sentencing Reform**, introduced 2.13.19. Currently a placeholder, the bill expresses the intent of the legislature to develop and enact legislation to reform Ohio's drug sentencing laws, without providing further details at this point.
- <u>SB 5</u> (Sens. Dolan, Kunze) **Promoting Prostitution Penalties**, introduced 2.13.19. Current law states a violation of RC 2907.22 (Promoting Prostitution) is an F4 and increased to an F3 if a minor is involved. The bill increases the penalty to an F3 in additional circumstances: a previous conviction of violence; 2 or more previous convictions under RC 2907.22; or an accompanying conviction for a violation of RC 2925.03 (Drug Trafficking).
- <u>SB 6</u> (Sens. Coley, Hottinger) **Temporary Child Custody**, introduced 2.13.19. The bill authorizes and regulates "host family" organizations which take temporary custody of children with parental permission but outside state oversight through children services agencies and the courts.
- <u>SB 13</u> (Sen. Fedor) **Juvenile Human Trafficking Victims**, introduced 2.13.19. The bill requires a juvenile court to hold a delinquency complaint in abeyance in human trafficking cases and provides that the same elements for the offense of trafficking in persons that apply to a victim younger than 16 also apply to a victim who is age 16 or 17.
- <u>SB 18</u> (Sens. Antonio, Lehner) **Confining Pregnant Defendants**, introduced 2.13.19. The bill prohibits restraining or confining a woman during pregnancy or postpartum recovery.
- HB 24 (Rep. Hambley) **Humane Societies**, introduced 2.13.19. The bill allows probate judges to revoke the appointment of a humane society agent for just cause and provides a procedure. The bill requires that any humane society non-prosecution agreement be approved by the judge that presided over the probable cause hearing to determine whether animals should be impounded. The non-prosecution agreement cannot require payment of monies in excess of a "necessary and reasonable" standard.
- <u>SB 28</u> (Sen. Hottinger) **Protection Order Violation Penalties**, introduced 2.13.19. The bill increases the penalty for violating a protection order to an F3 if there are 2 or more previous protection order convictions, 3 or more previous Menacing, Agg Menacing, or Agg Trespassing Convictions, or 2 or more previous Menacing by Stalking convictions.
- <u>HB 69</u> (Rep. Perales) **Child Abuse Registry**, introduced 2.14.19. The bill requires the Attorney General to establish a publicly accessible child abuse registry.
