Address Confidentiality for Judges

Effective April 15, 2019, <u>House Bill 341</u> of the 132nd General Assembly adds judges and magistrates to the existing list of "designated public service workers" for whom certain personal and familial information is not subject to disclosure under public records law. The bill also gives judges and magistrates the ability to request the redaction of certain information from online public databases, explained in detail below.

Address Confidentiality and Redaction

The bill allows judges and magistrates to request that their addresses be redacted from any public record or database that is made available on the internet. Databases maintained by the county auditor are slightly different, in that the address cannot be redacted, but rather, the judge or magistrate can request that their name be replaced with initials instead.

How to Request Redaction

County Auditor Databases

Judges or their spouses who wish to have their names replaced with their initials on records or databases made available to the public by the county auditor may so request via affidavit. Your county auditor should have a form affidavit available for this purpose.

Any Other Online Public Records


Judges may request that their address be removed from a record that is available to the public on the Internet. The request must be made in writing on a form promulgated by the attorney general. That form is included with this flier, and can be found here.

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REQUEST TO REDACT ADDRESS

Pursuant to O.R.C. 149.45(D)(1), a "designated public service worker" may file this form with a public office, other than a county auditor's office, to request that the address of the person making the request be redacted from any record made available by that office to the public on the internet. For purposes of this law, "designated public service worker" is defined at O.R.C. 149.43(A)(7). Legislative amendments have expanded the definition of "designated public service worker." Effective March 22, 2019, EMS medical directors, members of a cooperating physician advisory board, and board of pharmacy employees are added to the list of designated public service workers. (2018 Sub. S.B. 229 (Gen. Assembly 132)). Effective April 5, 2019, county or multicounty correctional employees are added. (2018 Sub. S.B. 214 (Gen. Assembly 132)). Effective April 15, 2019, judges and magistrates are added. (2018 Sub. H.B. 341 (Gen. Assembly 132)). Upon receiving a request for redaction, a public office shall act within five (5) business days to either redact the requested information or provide a verbal or written explanation to the individual as to why a requested redaction is not practicable. O.R.C. 149.45(D)(2).
