Due to the recommendations of the Ohio Department of Health and the U.S. Center for Disease Control regarding the COVID-19 pandemic that gatherings of people be limited in numbers, and for the protection of the parties, attorneys, witnesses, court staff, Sheriff's Deputies and the public, the Court has previously entered orders regarding attendance of persons at all court proceedings in the General and Domestic Relations Divisions of the Common Pleas Court including the right of the Court's Bailiffs and the Highland County Sheriff and his deputies to enforce those rules including requiring persons exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19 to leave the building.

Therefore, it is hereby ordered that any person who enters either the main courtroom or the Domestic Relations courtroom, or are present for a hearing, shall upon request of a bailiff or deputy sheriff, submit to a temperature check by a non-invasive scanning thermometer as part of their evaluation as to whether that person may be exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19 and is subject to being ordered to leave the building as provided in the Court's order.
