Legislative News: Two-Week Review

- <u>SB 305</u> (Sen. Wilson) **Lebanon Municipal Court**, introduced 7.23.24. The bill changes the status of the judge of the Lebanon Municipal Court from part-time to full-time. A companion bill was introduced in the House on 8.7.24 (HB 649).
- <u>HB 644</u> (Reps. Grim, Thomas) **Firearms Restrictions**, introduced 7.29.24. The bill prohibits the import, manufacture, sale, transfer, or possession of a trigger crank, a bump-fire device, or any part, combination of parts, component, device, attachment, or accessory that accelerates the rate of fire of a semiautomatic firearm. A violation of this prohibition can lead to a firearm disability. A companion bill was introduced in the Senate on 7.30.24 (<u>SB 307</u>).
- <u>HB 646</u> (Rep. Miller, J.) **Digital Drivers' License and State ID**, introduced 7.29.24. The bill authorizes the use of a digital driver's license or state identification card.
- On 7.23.24, the Ohio Supreme Court decided <u>In re R.G.M.</u>, (Slip Opinion No. 2024-Ohio-2737), where it held that a **parent in a legal custody proceeding** in juvenile court does not have the same legal safeguards as a parent facing the loss of parental rights in a permanent custody proceeding. In the case, a parent was found to have no right to question an absent expert who submitted a report in a custody hearing.
- On 7.25.24, the Ohio Supreme Court decided <u>Berkheimer v. REKM LLC</u>, (Slip Opinion No. 2024-Ohio-0293), where the **reasonable-expectation test** in lawsuits was reviewed; a restaurant patron who ordered boneless chicken wings could have reasonably expected to find a piece of bone in his meal and guarded against swallowing it, and therefore his lawsuit was dismissed without going to a jury.
- Request for Assistance: The Ohio Department of Medicaid is exploring ways to help improve transitions for individuals who were formerly incarcerated; and has developed a survey to better understand people's experiences of returning to their community after incarceration. ODM is asking that stakeholders take or share the <u>survey</u>.
- The Center for Jury Studies at the National Center for State Courts is now accepting nominations for the **G. Thomas Munsterman Award for Jury Innovation**. The award recognizes improvements or innovations in jury operations, management or technology. <u>Nominations</u> accepted until 9.13.24.
- **Did you know?** <u>Training videos</u> for both grand juries and petit juries are available from the Supreme Court.
