## Legislative News: Two-Week Review

- In <u>State v. Crawl.</u> (Slip Opinion No. 2025-Ohio-2799), decided 8.12.25, the Ohio Supreme Court ruled that the **menacing-by-stalking statute**, R.C. 2903.211, does not require explicit threats, intentional infliction of emotional distress, or comments or actions occurring in-person; nor does it require the victim to block the offender from making further social media posts. The elements of R.C. 2903.211 are met if the defendant engaged in a pattern of conduct knowingly causing another person to believe that the defendant would cause physical harm or mental distress to the other person or a family or household member of the other person.
- In <u>State v. Staffrey</u>, (Slip Opinion No. 2025-Ohio-2889), decided on 8.19.25, the Ohio Supreme Court ruled that an appeals court wrongly granted **judicial release** to an offender serving an "indefinite" prison sentence for crimes committed in 1995. The definition of "eligible offender" for purposes of judicial release under R.C. 2929.20 includes only those offenders serving a "stated prison term."
- In <u>State v. T.W.C.</u>, (Slip Opinion No. 2025-Ohio-2890), decided on 8.19.25, the Ohio Supreme Court ruled that an offender convicted of an F4 or F5 must fully pay **court-ordered restitution** to be eligible to apply for sealing a criminal record. Regardless of whether the entry identifies the restitution order as "a civil judgment," it remains a sanction that is part of the sentence.
- <u>Sup.R.5</u>, which will be effective 9.1.25, requires a local rule on **reporting to law enforcement**. The local rule must establish procedures and timelines for obtaining and submitting fingerprints and reporting information; establish procedures and timelines for reporting information regarding protection orders; establish procedures and timelines for reporting information to the Bureau of Motor Vehicles and Ohio Department of Public Safety; establish procedures to ensure completeness and accuracy of records in the event of an audit by the FBI, BCI, or state or local auditors.
- The public comment period for a proposed change to the Ohio Rules of Professional Conduct ends 8.28.25 (<u>Prof.Cond.R. 8.4</u>, **misconduct**); and the public comment period for a proposed change to the Rules for the Government of the Bar ends 8.28.25 (<u>Gov.BarR.
